Dear Songwriters,

The Three Rivers Folklife Society is again hosting the Jane Titland Memorial Songwriting Contest in conjunction with the 30th annual Tumbleweed Music Festival. This year's festival will begin on Friday, September 4, 2026 in Richland, Washington's Howard Amon park, and will also have a virtual component for those performers who cannot travel to Richland.

Each year's contest features a new song topic based on the theme of the festival for that year. The festival theme for this year will be *Tumbleweed - Thirty Years by the River*. Applications MUST be received by <u>email</u>, <u>US mail</u> or <u>land</u> <u>carrier</u> by **April 20, 2026**. Songwriting Contest entrants need not be Tumbleweed Music Festival participants, however we strongly urge you to apply!

To enter, you must submit (electronically or by a physical copy) a completed application, along with a recording of a performance (by you) of your entry song, and a lyric sheet. You may submit your application, recorded performance, and lyric sheet either electronically, to tumbleweedsubmissions@gmail.com, or by US mail or land carrier, addressed to Songwriting Contest, C/O 3RFS, PO Box 1098, Richland, WA 99352. If available, we ask that you please include a biography / press kit, photos of yourself or your group, and website/social media information (including tipjar links).

Preliminary entry screening will be conducted in May and June, and ten finalists and three alternates will be notified by early July. The finalists will perform their songs live at the Festival on Saturday afternoon. Note that if a finalist is not able to perform live at the Festival, an alternate will take their place. Please also note that <u>finalists are requested to provide a video of them performing their song for a songwriting contest finalist compilation that will be posted to our virtual festival website.</u> (See Attachment 1 below for video file requirements).

The top three winners will receive the following prizes:

- First place will receive \$300 and the 2026 Tumbleweed Songwriting Contest trophy. The winner will perform their winning song during the Saturday night concert at the Festival.
- Second place will receive \$150.
- Third place will receive \$75.
- The "People's Choice" (voted on by the audience at the Saturday Songwriting Finalist's performance) will receive \$50.

Rules and Procedures:

- Each competing artist or collaborating group may enter one original song in the contest.
- The song must comprise the original lyrics and melody of the writer(s).
- Songs may have been previously recorded.
- The writer(s) will retain all rights to the song.
- Writers must submit a recording and lyric sheet as instructed on the attached contest entry form.
- Songs must be performed by the writer(s), though others may perform with the writer(s).
- The submitted recording should be representative of a live performance.
- All decisions of the judging panel are final.

- Finalists must submit a video recording of their performance of their song to be considered for a prize.
- Judging criteria include, first and foremost, that the song must have **original melody and lyrics**, and **must be on topic**.
- Other judging criteria:
 - Flow and Rhythm
 - Lyric Craft
 - Melody
 - Imagery
 - Originality
 - Emotional Impact
 - Vocal Skills
 - Passion and Believability
 - Professionalism
 - Musicianship

Photo/Video Release: If accepted as a finalist, you agree to allow your photo and the video of your performance to be used by 3RFS for publicity or grant application purposes, including traditional radio, television, and print media as well as clips from your public social media postings.

There's no entry fee, so why not challenge yourself?

Attachment 1: Contest Finalist's Video Requirements

We're asking for our Songwriting Finalists to record a video of a performance of your song, to be able to present a compilation of the finalists on our virtual festival website. We'd like to present your recorded performances in the highest quality possible. To avoid any problems when we present your performances to the world, please use our requirements below for your submissions.

- Record your video at the highest resolution possible, up to 4K; we desire at least 1080p if at all possible.
- Video formats: .mp4 or .mov. <u>Please ask us before sending any other format</u>. If all you can use is a phone or a webcam, please make sure that the phone is in the HORIZONTAL position when you record your performance. (Note that we will review all recorded performances; if we judge that the quality is too low, we reserve the right to not include the performance in the festival. [We'll be quite forgiving]).
- If at all possible, please record your audio to a separate, high-quality file (e.g., .WAV, .mp4/AAC, FLAC, etc.) at the highest sample rate possible; submit this file along with your video file (with its native audio track intact), and we'll take care of the final assembly.
- Please leave at least 5 seconds at the beginning and the ending of your recording that are just silent this makes editing easier and allows for subsequent removal of ambient sounds, if needed.
- File transfers will be via a link that will be sent to you. Please send an email to tumbleweedsubmissions@gmail.com when you are ready to submit, and we'll send you a link for you to upload your video and audio files.
- When you send the files for your performances, please make sure to send us the address(es) of your own websites (for your merchandise) and tip jar(s), so that we may be sure to include them on your performance screen *and* on a separate Performer Bio page on the festival site that will remain live as long as the festival remains online.
- Also, please send us the wording you would like for a copyright statement to scroll across the bottom of the screen at the beginning of your segment.
